An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Additionally, two categorical classrooms serve children with severe multiple impairments and/or neurological differences. General education students come from the surrounding neighborhoods, as well as from areas further removed. POHI, VI and SXI students are drawn from all of Kent County.
