For the 2017-18 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is performing in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school has one or two underperforming student subgroups. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school has three or more underperforming student subgroups. Schools with higher levels of performance are not identified with any of these labels.

Mission Statement


